# Invisible Lives Child & Family Support

#### The Service

Invisible Lives provides information, advice and support to children, young people and their families affected by parental\* offending behaviours or the Criminal Justice System

#### **Invisible Lives:**

- Supports children (aged 0-19years) and their families through the stages of arrest, court, imprisonment and release.
- Provides 1-1 support or group based sessions in the home and school for up to 8 sessions, with the potential for further support based on reviews and outcomes.\*\*
- Provides a whole family approach to support the reduction of re-offending by way of strengthening relationships and maintaining family ties.
- Addresses fears, anxieties and worries of children and their families by building emotional resilience and positive mental health.
- Liaises with all organisations that may be involved to provide a seamless and transparent support package.

## The Service

Invisible Lives provides a range of advice and support to professionals and families including:

- Support parents/carers and professionals in identifying and responding to children's feelings with age appropriate services and support.
- Support for families dealing with the shock, loss of a family member, isolation and the stigma of having a family member in prison.
- Help and signpost families with debt management, benefit changes, housing issues and budgeting.
- To prepare children and families for their first prison visits.
- To support schools and early years settings with practical advice, support and worksheets when working with children and young people.
- Practical advice on Criminal Justice system from attending court, visiting a prison to claiming reimbursements for Assisted Prison Visits (APV) along with information about general and family day visits.

#### Who can refer?

All agencies working with children including;

- Primary and Secondary Schools
- Youth Offending Service, Police, Probation and other criminal justice system
- Social Care and Family Solutions
- Self Referrals
